

COVID-19 Vaccines: An Overview

Why should I get vaccinated?

I'm worried that the trials were rushed and that this vaccine may not be safe, especially for long term side effects.

Do I still need to wear a mask and social distance after I get the vaccine?

What if I have more questions about the vaccine?

What if I don't have transportation to get my vaccine?

To protect yourself, friends and family.

No shortcuts were taken in assessing COVID-19 vaccines for safety. COVID-19 vaccines have undergone safety evaluations similar to other vaccines.

Yes, after being vaccinated you should still wear a mask, socially distance, and wash your hands frequently with soap.

What can I expect if I get the COVID-19 vaccine?



How many doses is the vaccine?

When do I get my second dose?

How effective are the vaccines according to current studies?

What are the side effects I can expect?

mRNA Vaccines

2 dose series

21 days (Pfizer) or 28 days (Moderna)

One dose only provides limited protection from COVID-19. The strongest protection is at least 2 weeks after your second dose.

Common side effects include injection site pain, tiredness, headache, muscle/joint pain, chills, fever, nausea, or vomiting. Serious but rare side effects include an allergic reaction.
